New Draft: Uniform Statement

Our uniform identifies each student as a member of Athboy Community School. The wearing of the uniform is an important part of belonging to the school community. All students must wear the correct and complete uniform while travelling to and from school, within the school building and grounds, or on school trips, unless otherwise stated. Parents/guardians are requested to ensure that students come to school with the full uniform.

Students who present in incomplete uniform must have a note or send in a notification on the school app explaining the reason for the omission. If a student is unable to wear an item of uniform due a medical reason, parents/guardians must notify the year head in writing, in person or by phone. Students without a note will be offered a spare item of clothing which can be used temporarily for the day. Alternatively, the parents/guardians may bring the missing items to the school or bring the student home to change.

Students must not wear clothing items which are not part of the uniform to school. Students wearing non- uniform items may be asked to leave them with the year head or principal and collect at the end of the day. Refusal to wear the school jacket or any other item of clothing will result in a sanction in the Code of Behaviour.

The following uniform items are compulsory for all students and are available from Faulkner's Fashions, Mc Elhinney's Mans Shop (Athboy) and Murtagh's (Trim):

*Must be black Morgan and Co. (Boys), black Susst Gaby (Girls).

P.E. Uniform

The school PE uniform must be worn by all students and can be worn for the full day when PE class is scheduled.

All uniform items should be marked with identity labels.

Health and Safety.

The following items are likely to cause a health and safety breach when worn to school: long dangling or hoop earrings, long fake nails. Studs are the only items of jewellery which may be safely worn in school.
